It's Not Great to Be Late! (Are you on time?)

Please note our arrangements for the commencement of the school day. When the music starts to play at 8.55am we ask students to get a

drink, go to the toilet and line up - before the bell goes at 9.00am.

Also a reminder of the importance of students arriving at school on time. Unfortunately, we are encountering a larger number of students who appear at the classroom after nine o'clock. It proves to be particularly daunting for the child if the class group is not in the classroom since the school day has started and the students may already be engaged in another learning activity in another part of the school. It is also disruptive for the rest of the class – who have settled into the mornings learning activities.

If your child arrives after 9.00am, please remember to come past the office and sign in - an important student security and safety action step.

REMINDER Reading and Classroom Volunteer Session

Just a reminder for all parents, especially in the junior area, who would love to stay and help to with classroom reading and literacy rotations that there is an information secession being conducted tomorrow morning at 9:15am – 10am(just after reading finishes). This session will give you tips not only regarding how to best help your child with reading, but also give ideas and strategies for when you are helping out in the classroom. This is also a refresher for perhaps some of our more 'seasoned families'.



<u>Sustainability</u>



All of you will have received your child's classroom newsletter. In it you will have noticed that, as a whole school, our focus for this year is **water**. We will be focussing on reducing the amount of water that we use and waste in the school and investigating ways that we can be more resourceful with our water usage. In line with being a sustainable school, we encourage you to include food that does

not contain packaging (nude food) in your children's lunch boxes. Schools are not able to access recycling bins through the council (like we all have at home) so therefore any packaging that comes into the school will be sent home ('Carry In, Carry Out Policy') so that you can dispose of accordingly – so please be mindful of this when preparing your child's lunch.

Getting to Know You Interviews

The feedback from the interview process so far has been very positive from both a parent and teacher perspective. These interviews have given parents the opportunity to provide valuable background information pertaining to their students' social, emotional and academic background, as well as an ideal starting point for the communication of expectations and goals for the learning and teaching year. It is also important for our students to know that we all work in partnership with each other. If you have not yet made a time to meet your child's classroom teacher – please do so as soon as possible.

NORTH EAST LINK AUTHORITY - COMMUNITY WORKSHOPS

North East Link is inviting the school community to take part in upcoming workshops on Tuesday 27 February, 6pm-8.30pm.

You can choose between three topics: urban design, walking and cycling or your environment. This is our opportunity to get involved in meaningful discussions and to contribute to making the design for North East Link as good as it can be. North East Link are encouraging families to apply so they can tell them what matters to you.

2018 Belle Vue Primary School Council Elections

The Department of Education and Training provides the following general information to assist parents who may be considering School Council membership.

What is a school council and what does it do?

All government schools in Victoria have a school council. They are legally formed bodies that are given powers to set the key directions of a school within centrally provided guidelines. Who is on the school council?

There are three possible categories of membership:

- A mandated elected parent category. More than one third of the total members must be from this category. Department of Education and Training (DET) employees can be parent members at their child's school.
- A mandated elected DET employee category. Members of this category may make up no more than one third of the total membership of school council. The principal of the school is automatically one of these members.
- An optional community member category. Its members are coopted by a decision of the

council because of their special skills, interests or experiences. DET employees are not eligible to be community members.

The term of office for members is two years. Half the members must retire each year and this creates vacancies for the annual school council elections.

Why is parent membership so important?

Parents on school councils provide important viewpoints and have valuable skills that can help shape the direction of the school.

Those parents who become active on a school council find their involvement satisfying in itself and may also find that their children feel a greater sense of belonging.

Belle Vue Primary School Council conducts eight evening meetings each year (Approximately two meetings each term).

What do I need to do to stand for Belle Vue Primary School Council membership?

A Notice of Election and Call for Nominations notice is displayed at the front office. If you are interested in gaining nomination you will need to arrange for someone to nominate and second you as a candidate. Nomination forms are now available from the Office. Once the nomination form is completed, please return it to the Office

Essential Book Supplies and Voluntary Contributions

Funding challenges for all schools continue to be at the forefront of budget planning, all school operations, program delivery and allocation of both teaching and physical resources. 2018 is shaping as a year where we are being asked to operate and manage our school in an environment of greater fiscal restraint, significant cuts to funding and revenue and greater levels of local decision making and autonomy. Head Lice

While children are at school, many families will have contact with head lice. We would like to remind the whole school community to take the time to check their children's hair regularly.

The information here will help you treat and control head lice.

Finding head lice

Many lice do not cause an itch, so you have to **look carefully to find** them.

Head lice are found on hair itself and

move to the scalp to feed. They have six legs which end in a claw and they rarely fall from the head. Louse eggs (also called nits) are laid within 1.5cm of the scalp and are firmly attached to the hair. They resemble dandruff but can't be brushed off.

Lice can crawl and hide. The easiest and most effective way to find them is to follow these steps:

- Comb any type of hair conditioner on dry, brushed hair.
 This stuns the lice and makes it difficult for them to grip the hair or run around.
- 2. Now comb sections of the hair with a fine tooth head lice comb.
- 3. Wipe the conditioner from the comb onto a paper towel or tissue.
- 4. Look on the tissue and on the comb for lice and eggs.
- 5. Repeat the combing or every part of the head at least 4 or 5 times.

Preventing head lice

- ✓ There is no product available to prevent head lice.
- ✓ Using the **conditioner and comb method once a week** will help you detect any head lice early and minimise the problem.
- ✓ Washing the child's pillow case in hot water and drying in the clothes dryer is advisable.
- ✓ Head lice do not discriminate whether male or female; we are now asking that you please tie back long hair in order to prevent the spread of head lice!

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors, excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF will be provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- · \$125 for primary school students
- · \$225 for secondary school students.
