**Gardens**

Last weekend we had some workmen in to remove the trees planted in the garden between the Admin and the BER buildings. The trees were not only (too) many for that space, they were all clustered together, of poor quality and the roots were beginning to crack the asphalt. Our arborist was also concerned about the foundations of the BER. While they were removing the trees we had them take out the overgrown bushes along the wall of the Art and 3/4W classrooms.

This means we need to replant! Carney Kucharski used to run his own landscaping company – so very knowledgeable about the types of indigenous hedges and plants that will thrive in this area and will purchase the plants on behalf of the school.

### Teacher Availability

Teachers are outside on duty every afternoon in order to make themselves available to parents for a quick chat or to discuss any minor issues that may have arisen throughout the day. They are also available for a longer, more formal meeting, if required, at a mutually agreeable time – upon request. Unfortunately, more often than not, I see parents wanting to have a 'quick word' after the 9am bell has gone. Please be mindful that once that bell goes the duty of care for all staff is with their class – they are not available for a 'chat'. If you have any concerns that you want the teacher to be aware of you have the following options available to you in order to address these concerns:

1. leave a message at the office
2. catch the class teacher after school
3. make an appointment (through the office) at a mutually agreeable time
4. email the school and ask for the email to be forwarded on to the classroom teacher.

We do value the rapport we have with our parents, and are mindful that because of this positive relationship, parents are comfortable walking into classrooms. This is fabulous, but at the same time we do ask that you are considerate of teaching time - if every parent of every child walked in for a 'quick word' – not a lot of teaching would happen! Thank you for your understanding.

## CONGRATULATIONS! Guess Who Won the Lottery!?!?

Now that we have your attention – let's discuss traffic before and after school. Our most precious cargo are being continually placed at risk by those who love them most.

### Double Parking

Every day we see parent's double parking – to let their child in and out of the car. Last week we had a very *near* miss when one child was let out of their double parked car, who inadvertently walked behind a car reversing out of their space.

The parent who nearly ran the child down was most distressed. This is not ok! Under no circumstance should any child be placed at risk like that.

It is your responsibility as a parent to pull into the curb and park the car safely before letting your child in, or out, of the car.

### 2min Drop Off Zone

Isn't really 2 minutes, is it? If you intend to stay in the school grounds longer than the two minutes indicated on the sign – please park in the surrounding streets that have unlimited street parking. This allows those parents who do wish to drop off and pick up 'on the move' to do so safely.

### 3 (million) Point Turns

At the end of (nearly) every newsletter we include the 'Council Recommended Route' for safe drop off and pick up in Highview Road. U-turns of any sort are not permitted, but unfortunately, they are a regular occurrence.

We attempt to put measures in place to keep our children safe and yet we are continually surprised, (horrified!), at some of the driving behaviour we see on a daily basis.

### So - it is time to take action!

- We will ask Council to send around parking inspectors.
- Staff will be out on the footpath and vigilant about not letting children out to get into (or out of) a double parked car – and will speak to those parents if need.
- We will take down number plates of those parents who are continually placing our children's' lives at risk.

It only takes one mistake – don't make it *your* mistake!

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# DIGITAL TECHNOLOGIES & CODING IN GRADE 3/4

In line with the Victorian Curriculum, this year we have introduced as part of our core studies, Digital Technologies. During Digital Technologies the students in 3/4 have been working on creating and displaying a webpage using pictures taken through a webcam, writing information in html and exporting this to a webpage via internet explorer. The students have acquired and applied specific ways of thinking about problem-solving to create innovative, purpose-designed digital solutions.

Ric Zalewski began working with our 5/6 cohort in 2017 and this year we have him working with all year levels (from P – 6). The Digital Technology lessons can be as simple as students designing solutions to simple problems using a sequence of steps and decisions, through to building and programming their own games and coding web pages. Ric brings another level of expertise and enthusiasm to these weekly lessons.



This week, 3/4 have been using Scratch, which is a platform game with different puzzles in each level, where they must play through from level 1 to unlock all of the chapters. The game teaches the students how to code using the python language and has a final quiz question at the end where you must define a method using what you have learned from the game.

As you can see from the pictures, this program is very engaging and teaches the students a new method of processing information.



## SAME-DAY NOTIFICATION OF UNEXPLAINED STUDENT ABSENCES

### Fact sheet for parents/carers

If your child is sick or absent, you are required to notify their school as soon as possible **on the day of absence** using one of the following methods:

1. **Online:** log the absence directly using your school's IT platform – Team App.
2. **Telephone:** the school office 9859 6123 and let the staff know your child's name, class, date of absences and reason.
3. **Email:** the school [belle.vue.ps@edumail.vic.gov.au](mailto:belle.vue.ps@edumail.vic.gov.au) and provide the staff with your child's name, class, date of absences and reason.

Notifying the school of your child's absence either prior to, or on the day that they will be away, helps ensure the safety and wellbeing of children and will fulfil your legal responsibility.

### Why do I need to notify the school if my child is absent?

Schools need to know when and why a child is absent and you need to know if your child isn't at school.

From the end of Term 2 2018, all Victorian government schools are required to contact parents/carers as soon as practicable on the same day of an unexplained student absence. If your child is absent on a particular day and you have not contacted the school to explain why, the absence will be marked as unexplained.

This system also promotes daily school attendance. Going to school every day is the single most important part of your child's education, they learn new things every day – missing school puts them behind.

### What is your responsibility?

You are legally required to ensure your child attends school every day or you must provide an explanation for their absence. You should let the school know in advance of any upcoming absences or let them know in the morning if your child won't be at school. In order for schools to implement the same day notification requirement, it's essential that you provide the school with your most up-to-date contact details.

Generally one notification will be sent per family. Should there be circumstances that require both parents and carers to be notified, please contact the school to make the necessary arrangements.

### What is the school's responsibility?

The school must notify you of an unexplained absence in relation to your child as soon as practicable on the same day.

Schools will let you know either by your school's online communications app, phone call or email. If you can't be reached because the school does not have your correct contact details (i.e. changed phone number, SMS/email failure notification received etc.), the school will attempt to make contact with any emergency contact/s nominated on your child's file held by the school. Where possible, this contact will be made on the same day of the unexplained absence.

### Where can I learn more about the process for managing student absences?

Ask your school for a copy of the *Attendance Policy* which outlines the school's processes and procedures for monitoring, recording and following-up of student absences.




